### Internet and Technology Integration for Educators

Integrate 120 explores the Internet as a classroom tool for research, communication and collaboration. Teachers create technology rich lesson plans by using Internet Explorer or Netscape Navigator, copying and saving text and graphics from Web pages, using search engines, researching and citing sources, and incorporating e-mail basics into their curricula. Teachers will also explore the pragmatic uses of music, art, and chat rooms for class interaction.
